The Robbers Table

length **12**km (Includes lisnaharney & eskeradooey public rights of way) Approximate Time **3**hr **30**mins



The **Start** and **Finish** point for this accredited waymarked walk is Gortin Glen Forest Park (admission charges apply). On exiting the Forest Park, turn **left** onto the B48 Glenpark Road and after 50m turn **right** onto Lisnaharney Road. At the **junction** of

Castleroddy Road (approx. 1km from main road) stands the former Castleroddy Old National School. On the gable wall facing the road you will notice a weathered stone inscription "Castleroddy NS" with the letter "n" carved backwards. After another 1km turn right up the laneway (the 5th from the main road) marked by the sign "Lisnaharney Public Right of Way" and continue to follow the waymarker posts north over the western slopes of Curraghchosaly Mountain. At the summit



take in superb views (weather permitting) of the Bluestack and Derryveagh Mountains of Donegal to the west and the High Sperrins to the north east then travel down the

northern side. At the bottom of the lane **turn** left onto Liscabble Road, after 1km **turn** left again up the lane marked "Eskeradooey Public Right of Way" and climb **south** over Ballynatubbrit Mountain **passing** The Robbers Table, the site where supposed local seventeenth century Highwaymen (Rapparees as they were known) met up to divide their spoils after raiding the postal carriages that traversed this

upland landscape. Continue southward down through the farmyard back onto the Lisnaharney Road, then turn left to walk the 2km back to Gortin Glen Forest Park.
